### Discuss

1. The king of Syria demonstrated that raging anger and stupidity are always paired together. What is it about the emotion of anger that often times causes us to act irrationally or without thinking clearly? (2 King 6:8-14)
2. There is always hope, even when all we can see are problems. When Elisha prayed for his servant's eyes to be opened what did this do for the fearful servant? (2 Kings 6:15-17)
3. How do your eyes need to be opened to God's faithfulness/providence in your life? What is getting in the way of seeing this faithfulness/providence?
4. Why might God not want us to destroy our enemy, but rather feed them? (Matt 5:44-47)
5. Who are you currently having conflict with that maybe you should feed?
6. Relationships are built by love, not by winning and squelching... How can you begin showing love towards the ones whom you are at arms with?
